***Police Report for July 20<sup>th</sup>, 2016***

Throughout the month of June, we continued to see positive results from our zero tolerance policy. Our communities are safe, are businesses are thriving and our parks are filled with kids. At this time last year, we had drug addicts sleeping in our parks, harassing business patrons and doing open hand-to-hand drug deals on our main street, around our public restrooms and in several businesses. By building relationships and working with the City, community members and business owners **WE** have made a tremendous positive impact on our community. One of the more significant impacts is the reduced cost of on-view arrests. For the past several months, our on-view arrests for trespass, drugs and other vagrancy crimes have reduced dramatically. This is not a result of us relaxing our position, but a result of our efforts and commitment to keeping Granite Falls a safe place to live, work and visit.

During the first week of July, we celebrated our independence. Although several people were warned for illegal fireworks, we made no related arrests. In my July 1<sup>st</sup> report, I indicated that we were developing an alarming trend related to aggressive dogs. In July, we've continued to receive dog bite complaints. On July 9<sup>th</sup>, a young child was bitten by an aggressive dog in Jim Holm Park. Currently, 3 dogs are in quarantine at the Everett Animal Shelter for killing other domestic animals. To address this issue, I plan to outline our animal ordinances, and owner's responsibilities and culpabilities, on our social media site.

As we increase our population; and given these issues and other nuisance complaints, I strongly believe that our city would benefit greatly from having a code enforcement and animal control officer sometime in the near future to help ensure the safety of our community members; and to maintain and or improve our communities quality of life.

Like last year, our National Night Out event will be held in the field between the IGA and Alf's Pizza. For this National Night Out event, we have joined with the Granite Falls Fire Department to ensure a memorable and significant experience. During the event, we will have Operation Child ID; fire hose demonstration for kids (weather permitting); a Snohomish County Sheriff Marine Boat; a Snohomish County Sheriff helicopter hoist demonstration; a fire rescue demonstration; a bouncy house; fire hovercraft demonstration (TBA); social service information; Snohomish County Search and Rescue Vehicles; a Snohomish County Sheriff Motorcycle; Granite Falls Fire Trucks; Smokey the Bear; free hot dogs; and much more.

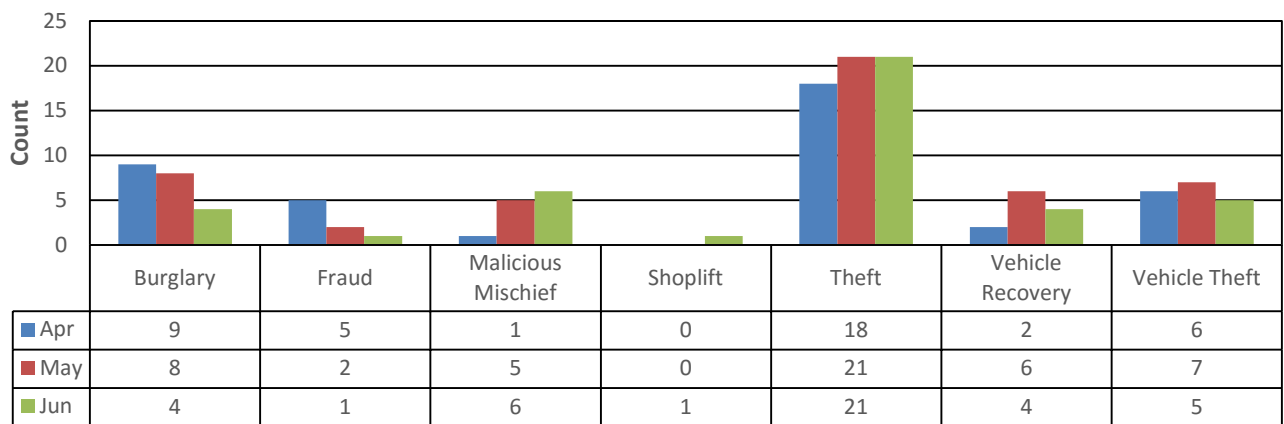

### Granite Falls Property Crime Last 3 Months - All Dispositions



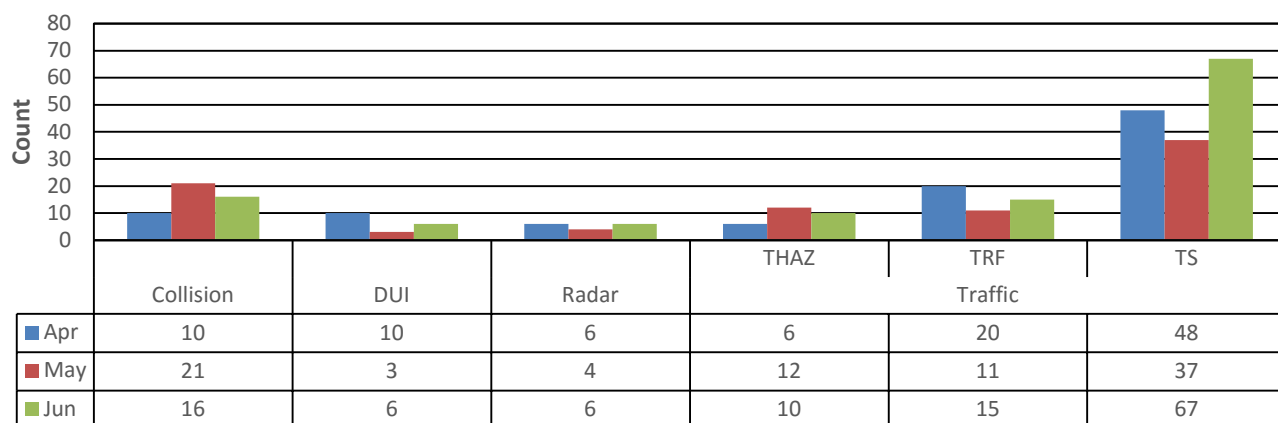
### Granite Falls Property Crime Last 3 Months - Dispositions A, B, I & R
